Preschool was once again very busy this week! Our Bible lesson was about Moses crossing the Red Sea with God's help. We danced the 'Elbow Swing' dance to our Jesus song. We began our new center stations this week, these happen after the children finish their names. There are 3 activities. They do the letter,

number, or fine motor skill activity that their name is on. We also worked on balance this week by walking the line.

In kindergarten math we used objects to compare sets to 10; solved problems by using the strategy make a model, used a number line to order numbers to 10, & described the order of objects. In reading we associated final dd with /d/, ss with /s/, & ll with /l/, identified the capital & lowercase li, associated li with /i/, identified initial /i/, discussed television programs, & read the story "Ladybug, Ladybug".

In 1st grade math we solved problems by using the skill write a number sentence, took a test on subtraction strategies to 12, & identified & related addition & subtraction facts to 12. In reading we discussed the difference between pretend & real, identified & marked short & long vowels, formed plurals with -s & -es, read the story "The Foolish Giant", & read the poem "When I am a Princess".

In 2nd grade math we solved problems by using the skill use a table, used mental math to add 2-digit numbers, took a test on 2-digit addition with & without regrouping, & counted back by tens to subtract multiples of ten. For reading we encoded pattern words with ow, ound, out, ouch, & our, discussed the meanings of homonyms, matched homonyms to

The month of memorizing is over! Our students did a great job performing Superhero's Unite & also did very well at Forensics hosted at MLC. We did some learning too. 8th grade math is working with graphs & writing equations based on graphs. In 7th grade, Andy is learning about rates & ratios. The 6th graders are comparing, adding, & subtracting fractions. In 5th grade they are comparing, adding, & subtracting decimals, & the 4th graders are working on time, temperature, & calendars. In grammar, we are reviewing irregular verbs & learning about direct objects. In lower science we are talking about 3 different states; solid, liquid, & gas. In

definitions, read words with tag-a-long e, & identified nouns, verbs, & adverbs in sentences.

In 3rd grade math we read & interpreted data in a pictograph & bar graph, solved problems by using the skill make a pictograph & bar graph, & took a survey, & recorded the results in a tally table. pictograph, & bar graph. In reading we read the story "How Do You Raise a Raisin?". The skills we focused on were drawing conclusions to identify important ideas to aid comprehension & wrote a story pretending to be a raisin farmer, focusing on the voice of the story. In 3rd grade social studies we recognized that communities use rules & laws to keep people safe, compared & contrasted communities, & recognized that communities exist all over the world. In 1^{st} & 2^{nd} grade we identified patriotic elements in a song, identified the need for rules & laws, & identified the consequences of breaking rules &

upper science we are talking about work, power, & machines.

In lower history, we finished up talking about land negotiations between the newly formed United States & the Native Americans. In upper history, they took the chapter 19 test, & will start learning about the early modern world in upcoming chapters.
