Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come! *2 Corinthians 5:17*

Anonymous hands hold a small cardboard box. A voice announces that the package just arrived in the mail and he's about to open it up. We watch as the hands cut open the mailing tape and remove the plastic wrapping. The item rotates so the camera can catch every angle while the voice describes every detail.

You have just entered the world of unboxing videos. It is fiercely competitive. People rush to post the first unboxing of a new phone or video game. And remember, they don't actually play the game or turn on the phone. They just show themselves opening the box and examining its contents. But thousands of people watch these videos every day.

New things hold so much promise in our imaginations that people get enjoyment from watching others open their new things. What if it could be just as easy to get a new self? That's what many of us try to do when the New Year arrives. We try to change ourselves by getting rid of a bad habit or starting a good one. What if those changes were as easy as opening a box and removing the plastic wrapper?



Quarter 1, 2018

It almost sounds that easy in 2 Corinthians 5:17. The Apostle Paul writes that anyone who belongs to Christ is a new creation. The old has gone. The new has come. But how can it possibly be that easy? How can I be a new person just by belonging to Jesus? How can I be new, when the old sins and temptations still cling to me?

It helps to read a little more from this inspired letter. A couple sentences further on, Paul writes, "God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting their sins against them." And then, a little further yet, "We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God."

God reconciled the world to himself when Jesus died on the cross. In other words, guilt and sin separated us from God. But God removed that barrier by charging it to his own Son. Jesus took the penalty and paid the price for our sin. Now God calls all people everywhere to receive this precious gift by putting their trust in Jesus. Trust that he has made things right between you and God.

Now, God calls us to unbox our new self every day. Remember what Jesus did for you. Put to death whatever belongs to your sinful nature. Rejoice in the new status you have as a redeemed and forgiven child of God. Live a new and holy life.

Next Meeting: March 6 at 7 p.m. The Quarterly Voter's meeting/ Congregation meeting met on January 16, 2018. Current membership is 250 members and 212 communicant members.

The **Trustees** reported that they were able to fix the women's toilet in the basement restroom rather than replacing it. After much time spent troubleshooting the heating situation in the church, the problem was found in the furnace and a new furnace was installed. The furnace was under warranty, although the labor to install and the many calls beforehand were not.

The **School Board** reported a current enrollment for this year at 14 preschoolers; 14 K-3rd; 15 4th- 8th making total enrollment 43 students. A couple upcoming events scheduled include: a spaghetti supper on January 26th with proceeds going to the upcoming 100th anniversary celebration of our school in August, and a basketball tournament on February 17th at the Rec. Center in Hutch. **Cemetery Board Reported** three burials for 2017. They also presented to the voters with a bid from David Telecky for the mowing of the church and cemeteries for next year which was accepted.

Pastor presented to the Voters two proposals from Elite EV for upgrading our sound system in church. There was much discussion about the two proposals and which one made the most sense for the money invested. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to accept the first proposal which was \$22,140, with a max of \$25,000.

It was decided at the meeting to disband the Long Range Planning Committee and to establish a more formal structure with the Events Committee.
