Walking in the Darkest Valley

"Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou art with me; thy rod and thy staff they comfort me." Psalm 23:4 KJV

How many people carry this verse in their back pocket? Not literally, but in a figurative sense. How many Christians think, "I'll have to remember that verse when I get close to death." And it is a great verse. We need not fear death because our Savior God is with us. And he leads us to the gates of everlasting life. The last verse of the psalm sums up our certainty of God's promise. "Surely goodness and love will follow me all the days of my life, and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever."

But if we simply bookmark this psalm for later use, we'll miss out on the greater part of its comfort. The valley of the shadow of death is not something we enter only during the sunset years of our life. In fact, we've always been walking in it. From the time we were born, through our teenage years, and into adulthood the shadow of death has been closer to us than our own shadow. Only by the grace of God have we not had to think about it very much.

But there are plenty of times when life forces us to think more seriously about the shadow of death. New parents have to hear all kinds of warnings regarding their newborns. Close calls on the highway make us realize how quickly life can end. Most of us, however, first feel the chill of the shadow of death in a doctor's office. And that chill follows us out the door. It keeps us awake, shivering in the dark. It saps our strength like a heavy weight hanging around our neck.

But really, what has changed? From before we felt the chill of the shadow of death until after, what changed? We always knew we were going to die. We always knew that Jesus would never leave us. But somehow now it seems more real. And that's when we need to revisit those words, "I will fear no evil." In other words, nothing bad is going to happen to us. We may have to deal with sickness, or weakness, or pain but nothing bad is going to happen to us. We may close our eyes in the sleep of death, but nothing bad is going to happen to us.

We have this confidence because Jesus experienced something that we never will. He experienced the absence of God. This is difficult to rationalize because Jesus is God. But as our Savior Jesus experienced all the bad things that our sins deserve. The full force of God's anger over sin and all the suffering of hell itself was laid upon Jesus. God turned his back on his one and only Son and so Jesus cried out, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

This makes us certain that our shepherd is with us. He comforts us with his unfailing love. He guides us with his faithful word. And he will never, ever leave us; even in the valley of the shadow of death.

The **Quarterly Voter's/ Congregational meeting** was held on January 21, 2020. Current membership is 244 members and 205 communicant members.


The **Trustees** reported a new electronic card was replaced in the organ.

G.I.L.L.

G.I.L.L. stand for "Grace and Immanuel Luther League". We serve the youth (4th to 12th grade) of our two congregations through Bible Study and fellowship activities.

In 2019 GILL decided to meet twice a month, on the second and third Sundays of each month at 6:30 at Grace. We started out the year with a Bible Study on how to defend Christian faith in an unbelieving world. We also studied how Christians react to the story of Santa Claus and other cultural mythology. On Friday, December 20 we con-

ducted our annual lock-in event at Grace. About a dozen young people attended. This school year we are inviting GILL families to help plan and schedule events. If your family would like to be in charge of planning a GILL event, please talk to Pastor DeVries.





Financial Development Plan



Rationale

The school has been the focus of Immanuel's ministry for 100 years. It's not the only thing we do. But it has been the main focus of our time, talents, and treasure. We have received significant blessings from this effort. Our children have received a strong foundation in Christian teaching. Many have gone on to excel in high school and college. Many have become spiritual leaders in our congregation. New families joining our congregation in the past few years have mentioned the school as their main reason for joining Immanuel.

In order for the school to continue its ministry, it needs a functional facility. The current building has served us well but falls short in several areas: having enough space for current and future class sizes, restroom facilities, storage space, recreation and physical education space, office space, and access control. In addition, though the current building is maintained, it has the appearance of age. This puts off families who are comparing us to the public school system.

Challenges

- The tuition model makes it difficult for some families to choose Christian education.
- Continued growth in class size may require adding staff, which puts additional stress on the budget.
- New facilities require significant capital expenditure. A significantly larger building would cost more to operate, offsetting potential maintenance savings.

Advantages

- Our sister church Grace joined us supporting the school directly. We have potential partners in St. Paul, Litchfield and St. John's, Glencoe. Several families from St. Paul are already sending students.
- Both Immanuel and Grace own our property and buildings outright. We have no significant debt.
- We have time to plan and set goals and milestones. Beginning now will make a new building possible down the road.
- We have a significant number of non-WELS students. We are the only Lutheran elementary school in the area.

Actions

- Immanuel and Grace incorporate stewardship emphasis into their yearly worship plans. Look at the blessings God has given through this ministry.
- School hosts a planning giving seminar to talk about designated gifts. Invite Immanuel, Grace, Zion, St. Peter, St. Paul. This seminar helps people understand the options for planned giving through their estate. Attendance does not obligate anyone to support the school. But that option is available.
- Engage Jeff Davis from Cornerstone Consulting Ministry for a free initial consultation.
- Submit Antioch grant application. (Deadlines in July and October.)
- Establish an Endowment Fund to support the ongoing needs of the school.

Cost: \$2,000,000




Immanuel Financial Development Plan (continued)

Goals

- 1) Support community needs (preschool, daycare, gym space)
- 2) Increase community awareness with a new building and available gym space (sports camps, tournaments, open gyms)
- 3) Become a better-fitted outreach arm of Immanuel and Grace (look attractive, look like a school)
- 4) Update and have a modernized building to better support students learning and have adequate workspace.
- 5) Have enough room to grow and support growth
- 6) Eliminate renting sports facilities

The big question is how can we do all this? How can we take on such a big project when we're already struggling? In 1 Samuel 14, God's people faced a similar situation. Their enemies were camped all around them. And every night their army got smaller as soldiers deserted and ran away. In other words, they were stuck. They didn't dare attack. And they couldn't just walk away. One day, Jonathan decided to try something. He and his armor bearer decided to go over to the enemy outpost. And Jonathan said, "Perhaps the Lord will act on our behalf. Nothing can hinder the Lord from saving, whether by many or by few." He didn't have a command from God or a promise of success. But his faith moved him to try something a little risky and see what God would provide.

Our school ministry feels stuck. We feel afraid to take on such a big project as building a new school. But we can't just walk away. Yet God is still able to do great things, whether by many or by few. Let's step forward in faith and see if the Lord will act on our behalf. He has richly blessed our efforts up to now. Those who have attended our school in the past continue to reap a harvest of righteousness and peace, the blessings that come from faith. Our school gives us the chance to share God's Word every day. It lets us equip our children for a bright future in this life and the life to come. Previous generations had less than we do. But they stepped forward in faith so that our church steeple could be seen for miles around. Perhaps God will let us be the generation that does the same thing for the school. Lift up your eyes to the hills; where does our help come from? Our help comes from the Lord, the maker of heaven and earth.







Opinion Poll Update

At the October 2019 Voter's meeting Mr. Gephart asked if the school board could begin a fundraising campaign for building a new school. This decision would allow the school board to move forward with the process of asking for support and commitments to a future building project. The school board recognizes that this is a big project that requires a long term view of our ministry. The voters assembly asked for more time and would reconsider the question at the annual meeting in January. The voters of Grace gave a similar response.

During the discussion the question came up whether women would be allowed to vote on this issue. This project is a big step for our congregations. And it's right to take into account the voices and opinions of all our church members. However, there is a distinction between voicing an opinion and making an authoritative decision. Our church believes and teaches that God has called men to exercise authoritative leadership in the church. Men are called by God to exercise Christ-like headship. The head makes decisions for the good of the body. Typically we make decisions by taking a vote among the voting members. Because of what God says in the Bible, our constitution says that voting members are "male communicant members who have reached the age of 18 and have been accepted by the voters' assembly." So we can't just let everyone vote without violating our constitution and the word of God.

But again, this is a big project. And since our leaders want to make a good decision for the good of the entire body, it makes sense to hear the voices and opinions of everyone in our church. We can do that without violating our constitution or the Bible, by taking a straw poll. This will be a vote that is not authoritative but informative. It will help the voters make their decision at the Annual Meeting on January 21st. The poll will consist of one question: "Should the voters allow the school board to conduct a fundraising campaign for building a new school?" The answers with be "Yes" or "No." The poll will be anonymous and each communicant member will get one response.



From the Opinion poll, a total of 75 responses were received. The results of the Opinion poll

were: 47 yes and 28 no.

Grace also did a similar poll with 40 people responding. The results were: 28 yes and 12 no.

During the January 2020 Annual Voter's meeting there were 25 men in attendance and the question "Should the voters allow the school board to conduct a fundraising campaign for building a new school?" was put to a vote. The results were: 20 yes and 5 no.

As we think about the future, it's useful to remember how hard the people before us had to work to start and run a school. They gave their best efforts to build a place where children could learn and grow. Over the years, our church as a whole and each of our families have received great blessings from having a school. Now we have a new generation coming up. If each of our 92 "giving units" could manage an extra \$100 per month, we could raise well over \$300 thousand in three years. Our sister church Grace is considering this same question and will vote at their April 2020 Voter's meeting.

We will pass these results to Grace as they intend to vote in April. If Grace also votes Yes on the vote, the school will move forward on the fundraising campaign. This vote was NOT to go ahead with a new school at this time, only a vote in favor of starting a fundraising campaign towards a new school.
