Is our culture becoming less religious? It certainly looks that way. Fewer people attend church than in previous decades. Popular culture has mocked Christianity for a long time. People in power openly question whether Christians should be elected to office or seated as judges.

Our culture is clearly changing. But it's not becoming less religious. If anything, it's becoming more religious. We should think of it as a change in religions. In place of Christianity, our culture is adopting a do-it-yourself religion. Individuals can still be Christian. Huge groups can still be Christian. But the dominant religion of our culture is becoming something else. And we don't quite know what to call it yet.

This new religion speaks the language of Christianity. It speaks of love. But not the love of Jesus. It speaks of right and wrong. But not the commands of God. It has its own definitions of love and of righteousness. Most of all, it speaks of guilt. If you break its commands or fail to live up to its definition of love, then you become guilty forever.

Once a person has been marked as guilty, they can be "cancelled." For this reason, the city of San Francisco has plans to rename George Washington High School. Washington himself has been marked for his sins. And now even his name must be removed from public view. Living people who fall short of the new morality can lose their jobs and reputations.

Because this new religion knows nothing of forgiveness. It seeks nothing more than to control human behavior using the threat of cancellation. In the book of Galatians, the Apostle Paul spoke to a very similar situation. False teachers had come into the church commanding rules and regulations. They tried to control the Galatians by teaching a righteousness that was not founded on Christ. So Paul encouraged the church, "It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery." (5:1)

We need to understand the meaning of Christian freedom. Christ took away the debt we owed. We had an obligation to obey the law perfectly or else suffer the consequences of eternal death. And Jesus removed that obligation. So no one can say, "You have to do thus and such, or you're a bad person." No one can say, "You have to follow this rule, or you will be guilty forever." Jesus has set us free from that.

It is true that we now have a new obligation, if you can call it that. We have an obligation to love Jesus. That means love him, serve him, follow his commands. A cynical person might say, "You've just snuck the commandments in through the back door!" But this is different. Before, we were slaves and subject to God's anger and punishment. Now, we are God's children and dearly loved. This new status comes with an additional advantage. No one can put new commands on you. No one can use their self-invented morality to burden you with guilt. Because of Jesus, your obligations to God have been fulfilled. You are free to serve God with a joyful heart. Hold on to that freedom. Don't let anyone burden you with a yoke of slavery.

The **Ouarterly** Voter's/ Congregational meeting was held on January 19, 2021. Current membership is 195 members and 236 Baptized souls.

The **Trustees** reported that the snow removal has been good so far. Also, will be looking into insulation for the attic in the parsonage.

The Cemetery Board reported 3 total burials for the 2020 year. Once again, Donna and Dave Telecky will mow the cemeteries this summer. We thank them for the great care given to our cemeteries.

New Business: Our Mission commitment for 2020 was \$18,000. However, we did exceed our goal with a total of \$19,200.09. Thank you to all who generously gave.

A question was raised about the cutting of the prairie land south of the parsonage. It was felt that in the future that it should be cut once a year in the fall/dry time and would require the permission of the council before proceeding with the cutting/ bailing of it.

Discussion was brought forth about using a portion of the Wally and Leona Plamann Thrivent monies to be earmarked for the school building fund. It was noted that the Plamanns were large promoters of our school and would want some of the money to be used for that purpose. It was agreed upon to earmark \$25,000 of the Plamann Thrivent fund to go to the school building fund.

The next Voter's/Congregational meeting will be after church in order to try and increase attendance/participation. The next meeting is scheduled for April 18, 2021 at 11 a.m.



Building Fundraiser Progress

In the beginning of 2020, both congregations, Grace and Immanuel, gave the school board approval to go forward with Jeff Davis from Cornerstone Stewardship Ministry to help us fundraise for a new school building. We were able to set up a meeting with him in October to give us a timeline and a plan for how we are going to fundraise. We are currently in the process of asking other WELS congregations in the area (St. Paul's, Litchfield and St. John's, Glencoe, St. Peter's, Darwin) along with St. John's, Cedar Mills to see if they would like to join us in this process. This would mean they would have fundraisers to not only help our school but, maybe a certain project in their own church.

We are also in the process of getting different

bids from other companies for our current architectural plans. We will have another meeting the end of February 2021 with Jeff to start our fundraiser plan with a leadership team and hopefully more congregations. Once that meeting happens in February, be on the lookout for handouts, announcement, and emails from the leadership team for ways to donate and give.

Our current building plans include 6 classrooms to make room for an expanding preschool, kindergarten, and day care, office space, kitchen, commons, and a gymnasium. The plans are also posted at church by the school table and also in the front entry of school.
