But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions—it is by grace you have been saved. -- Ephesians 2:4,5

Habitat for Humanity is a community organization that builds houses for poor people. When Habitat for Humanity builds a house for someone they at least require them to pick up a hammer and pound a few nails. If a wealthy friend takes you out for supper at an expensive restaurant, the least you can do is tip the waitress. Why should it be any different in our spiritual lives? If God poured out the life blood of his own Son, should we not be required to contribute something toward our salvation?

Paul says, "No, we are saved by grace alone." But these verses do not contain the word ``alone." It's true that the word ``alone" is not there in English or in Greek. But it is in the picture that Paul draws. You were dead in your trespasses and sins, Paul Imagine Jesus standing outside the tomb of Lazarus. And Lazarus has been dead four days. "Lord don't open the tomb. By this time there is a bad smell." But Jesus opens the tomb and calls in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" Does Lazarus wiggle his little toe? Does Lazarus make a decision to come out? Does he contribute the least little thing to his new life? No, it is by grace alone. In the same way grace alone rescued us from sin. Grace alone made us alive with Christ. Grace alone has saved us.

But someone may object, "Yes, but now that we are alive doesn't God command us to do something? Doesn't God require our obedience to make salvation complete?" How many times have you watched a football game that came down to one play? The game has been played with a huge effort while the kicker sits on the sideline. One field goal would determine the final outcome of the game. Imagine it. The crowd is screaming. The cameras are all trained on you. Under all that pressure you miss the easy kick. You drop the ball. The game is lost. Can you imagine the pressure if your eternal life depended on you? We just can't do it. No matter how small the requirement. If salvation depended on us at all, we would be lost.

But now look! Because of his grace God has not only made you alive. He has done everything to bring you into glory. In his eyes you are already seated at the heavenly banquet. You have already taken your place in glory through your Savior Jesus Christ.

It would take a thousand lifetimes to explore all the beauty of God's grace. But maybe, by scratching the surface just a little bit, we will want to love God more. Maybe we'll respond with a new sense of joy and wonder the next time we go to communion. Maybe we'll be inspired to struggle more against the sins that tempt us. May God grant it through his free and faithful grace. **Pastor DeVries**

**G.I.L.L.** stand for "**Grace and Immanuel Luther League**". We serve the youth (4th to 12th grade) of our two congregations through Bible Study and fellowship activities.

What does it mean to be "grown up"? If you are 14 or 15 years old, you might say getting your driver's license makes you grown up. A little later in life, you might mention going away to school or getting your first real job. These are important milestones in life. But there's another way to define a grown up. A grown up is someone who can be trusted to do what they say they are going to do. This means having a certain level of responsibility. You have to keep track of the things you said you would do. You have to put in time and effort to carry them out, even when they turn out harder than you thought. You have to be consistent in fulfilling your words; not just some of the time, but all of the time.

This definition is independent of age. People say that a 9 year old "behaves like a grown up" when she consistently does what she said she would do. But a 19 year old who doesn't do that "still has a lot of growing up to do."

God always does what he says he'll do. Joshua 21:45 says, "Not one of all the LORD'S good promises to the house of Israel failed; every one was fulfilled." The entire Bible tells the story of God keeping his word and fulfilling his promises. Most of all, we have to marvel at how God fulfilled his word in Genesis 3 by raising Jesus from the dead.

But we should also notice what God still does with his word. He gives us the power to do what we said we were going to do. As Christians, we repent of our sins. We say, "I don't want to live in sin." "I want to live a new life, a holy life." We can't keep that promise all by our self. So God pours out grace and power through his word. The Word says, "You are a new creation." "You died with Christ and were raised with him in your baptism." "You have been born again!" None of those things were done by you. God did them all in fulfillment of his promises. And through these words, God gives you power. He enables you to keep your promises.




