7 p.m. on Mondays Everyone Welcome! Director: Kim Schmeling There is no greater desperation than that of a student sitting in front of a half finished paper at two in the morning before the due date. Staring at the computer screen and unable to keep writing, the student goes on the internet and looks for other papers on a similar topic. Using his computer's cut and paste function, he copies paragraphs from the other papers into his own document. In half an hour the paper is finished and he goes to bed.

In the academic world, taking credit for someone else's work is the ultimate sin. But in the Christian faith, taking credit for someone else's work is the heart and core of our salvation. The Bible explains how we get credit for what Jesus did. Jesus never cheated on a paper. He never had an affair with someone else's spouse. He never wished something bad would happen to people who didn't like him. In short, he had none of the sins that make us worthy of death. But more than just a lack of sin, Jesus had true righteousness. He loved and served other people. He obeyed his parents with his whole heart. He always spoke the truth in love. The Bible books of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John tell in great detail how Jesus kept the law of God.

But that information by itself doesn't do me any good. I need righteousness for me. Because no one can get into heaven with a cloud of sins hanging over their head. That's where faith comes into the picture. God makes the promise in the Bible that Jesus did all those things *for* you and *for* me. In fact, that was the reason why he was born. He came to live under God's law, obey it perfectly, and give us the credit for his obedience. You don't have to do anything to get the credit. It's already yours as a gift.

So in the desperation that comes from sin, in the sadness and sorrow that comes from guilt, you have a place to turn. It's better than any web site that tells you how to overcome procrastination or create good habits. It's better than any life coach who will come and tell you how to improve your holiness and stop falling into sin. You have a Savior who gives you the credit for what he has done. You have Jesus who gives you his perfect righteousness in exchange for your sin. And in God's eyes that's the only way to get a passing grade into eternal life.
