Where Are You?

In the garden of Eden, the voice of God echoed through the trees. "Adam, where are you?" Why would Almighty God ask such a question? On the surface it sounds like a question of location. Are you over here or over there? But it was also a spiritual question. "Adam, where is your heart?" "What do you want?" "Whom do you love?" God asked this question because of his grace. God knew that Adam and Eve had sinned. He knew their hearts were filled with fear and loathing. Yet, in his boundless love, God chased after them. In his grace and mercy, God called out to Adam, calling him to repentance and faith.

God asks us the same question. Where are you, spiritually speaking? Where is your heart? Whom do you love? God asks these questions even though he knows the answers. He knows your hearts are filled with fear and shame, just like Adam and Eve. He knows about the things that keep you isolated and alone. You and I are not much different from Adam and Eve. We feel embarrassed by our sins and shortcomings. We know that God expects more of us. And how can we show our face when it has been so long?

In our modern age, we try to solve all our problems with technology. We have online devotions, Bible lessons, and live streams. All of them are temporary replacements for what we really need. We need the presence of God. We need to confess our sins and receive his absolution and forgiveness.

These human needs are the reason why the church gathers. It's not just that we like singing together and hearing God's word. We need it. Imagine if we all stayed home and watched a live stream of the best preacher on the internet. We would hear the word and sing some hymns. We might type messages to each other in the little text box. But how would we feel? I think we would still feel empty and alone. Something would be missing. We might even accept a lesser preacher if only we could gather together; if only we could see each other face to face and experience the presence of God!

Today the church continues to ask God's question. Where are you? Where is your heart? What do you love and treasure above all else? God loves and treasures you. Your life and your salvation is God's highest priority. Come gather with your fellow sinners to receive his grace and mercy. Come rejoice in God's goodness and be renewed by his presence.


Next Voter's/Congregational Meeting is Tuesday, January 17 at 7 p.m. Everyone Welcome! The **Quarterly Voter's/ Congregational Meeting** was Tuesday, October 18, 2022.

Pastor's Report: Monthly visits have been scheduled with our shut-ins. We have 4 students in catechism with one 8th grader scheduled for confirmation in the spring. With the new hymnals, Pastor's goal is to provide more leadership with the new psalms, as comments have been received concerning the new hymnal. No membership changes.

Treasurer's Report: The Trustees reported that the snow plowing contract with Pro Home Improvements (Larry Murphy) is in place for the winter. The deck/stairs project on the back of the parsonage is progressing with selected replacement of old/rotted lumber. The installation of the new AC system in the church basement has been completed. Another piece of trim has blown off the church in a recent windstorm and will be reattached.

The School Board Report: The current enrollment is 68 students; we have a new 7th grader starting on October 31 making 69 students. Soccer and volleyball have been completed for the season, with basketball season set to start after Thanksgiving. We have had the help of 1 student teacher thus far, with 1 more coming soon.

The newly amended copy of the Articles of Agreement for Immanuel Lutheran School Inc. were presented and discussed. As per our constitution, they are to be presented at one meeting and voted on at the next. Extra copies are in the church entryway for everyone to read. A final vote on the Articles will be at the Annual meeting in January.
